Course Title: <u>Automotive Heating and Air Conditioning</u>

Course Description:

Studies separate and combined automotive heaters and air conditioning, including direct and vacuum-operated controls, basic principles of refrigeration, adjustment, general servicing, and charging of air-conditioning systems. Lecture 1 hour. Laboratory 2 hours. Total 3 hours per week. 2 credits

General Course Purpose:

This course introduces anyone studying automotive service technology, hobbyists, and service technicians to the operation of safe and proper procedures of maintaining, diagnosing, and servicing automotive heating and air-conditioning systems and their controls.
