Course Prefix and Number: PNG 215

Credits: 2

Course Title: Patient-Centered Care II Clinical

Course Description: Provides the student an opportunity to implement classroom learning in a structured rehabilitation or other in-patient setting. Incorporates technical skills learned for the care of complex patients. Focuses on using the nursing process to plan and implement safe, evidence-based, patient-centered care. Prerequisites: PNG 120 and PNG 125; maintenance of all program document expectations, inclusive of CPR, health, and background requirements. Co-requisite: PNG 210. Laboratory 6 hours per week.

General Course Purpose: This second level course is for the practical nursing student to demonstrate mastery of identified concepts of safe, evidence-based, patient-centered care in a variety of health care environments.

Course Prerequisites and Co-requisites:

Prerequisites: PNG 120 and PNG 125; maintenance of all program document expectations, inclusive of CPR, health, and background requirements

Co-requisite: PNG 210
